Forward

In 2021 Junior Achievement surveyed over 300 young people between the age of 17 - 24. We wanted to compare feedback from students who went to university and those who chose to stay on the Island and start their careers.

We discovered that students who did not go to University felt less supported by their schools. They were not aware of the opportunities available to them, found job descriptions difficult to understand, or did not have the skills or work experience required for the job.

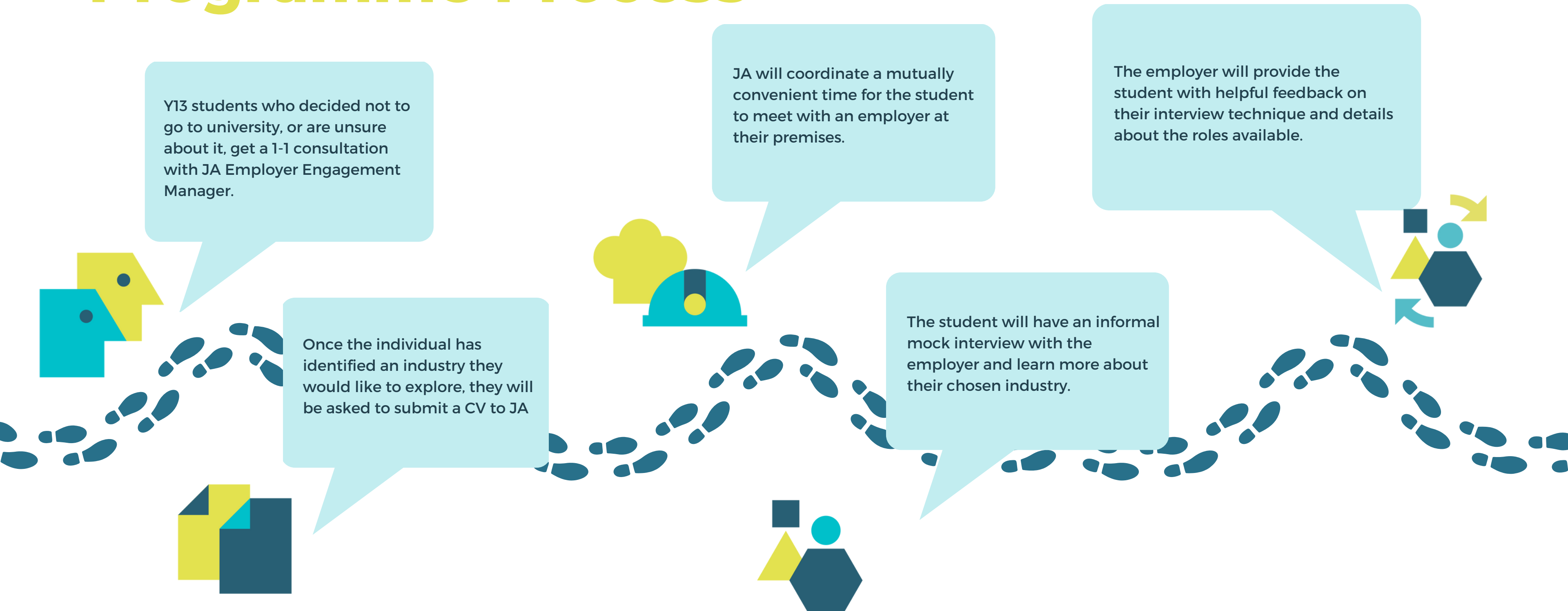
With the support of the Manx Lottery Trust funding, we were able to organise meetings with a wide range of organisations across the Isle of Man giving students a chance to explore job opportunities. The employers gave the students valuable feedback and advice, as well as the opportunity to meet their current employees and experience a working environment.

Success Indicators



Prior to taking part in the Career Launch Programme **58%** of the students didn't have a good understanding of the job opportunities available in the Isle of Man.

26% of the students had a mock interview with the host company.

33% of the students had an extended site visit during their meeting.

41% Receive useful feedback after their meeting with the host company.

8/10 was the average rating given by the students about how valuable the Career Launch Programme was for them.

Future Plans

After a year of running the Career Launch Programme and noticing the impact on Y13 students, we want to expand the project with the aim of reaching more students who want to learn about the different career opportunities on the Isle of Man.

For the last two years, there has been a teacher's pay dispute, which means that teachers are only delivering academic subjects. This combined with the lack of work experience is having a significant impact on students and their careers education.

The students we have spoken to expressed that they felt confused, nervous, stressed and unsure about how to find a job when they leave education. All of this feedback demonstrates the need to help students navigate a complex job market.

Added to the work done in this first year of the programme, we are planning to offer a CV Workshop to support the students' applications. We are also planning to promote the programme with more employers in the Isle of Man.

To achieve the expansion of the project and positively impact more students, we want to secure funding to run the programme for the next two years.
