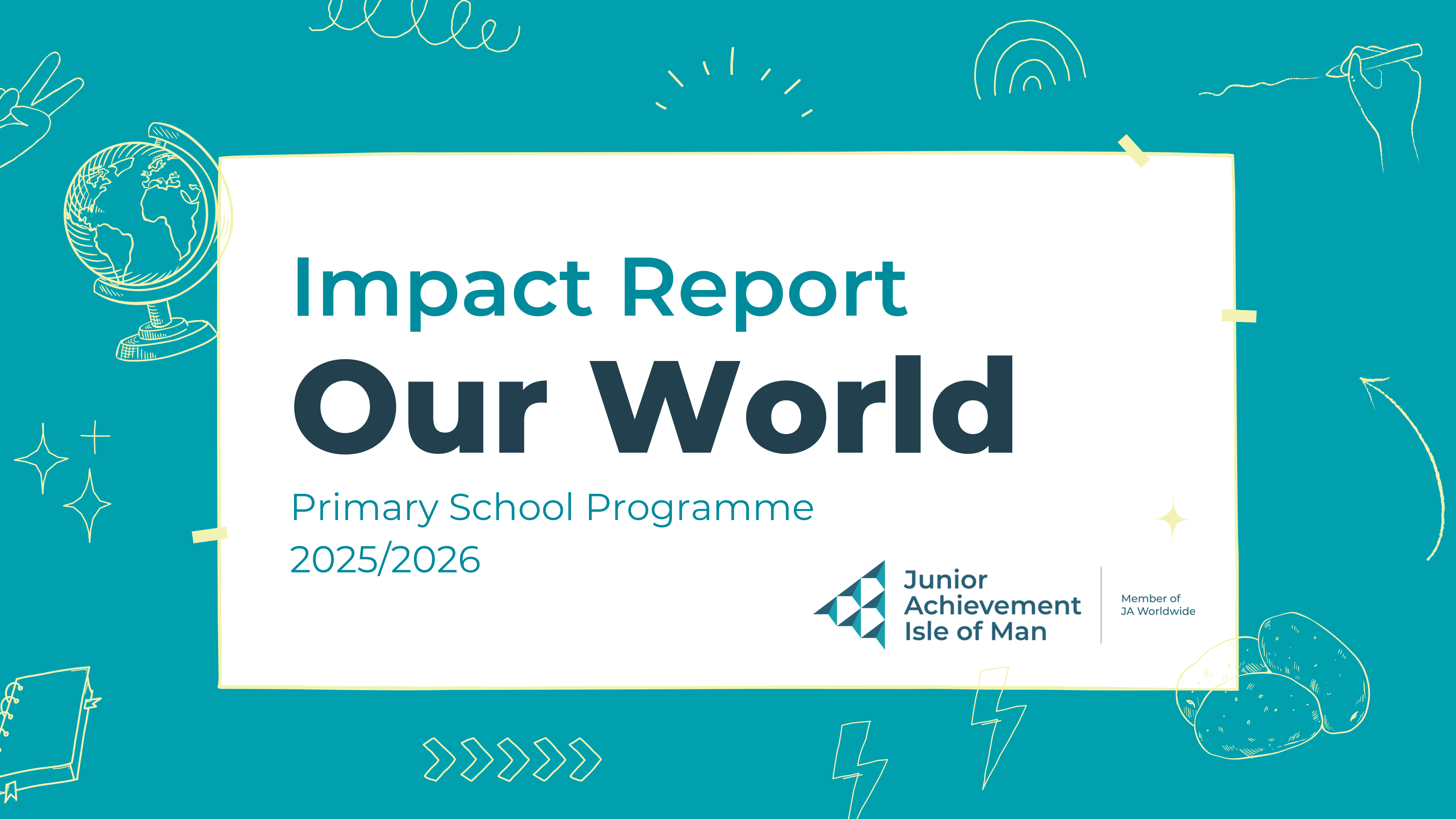

Introduction

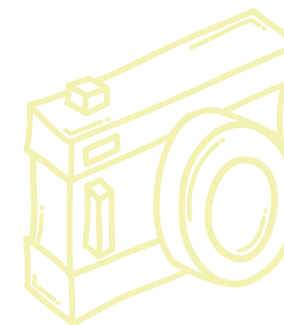
‘Our World’ is a JA Isle of Man programme designed for students of primary school age between 9 and 11 years.

In this programme two members of the JA Team, occasionally with one or two volunteers, visit a class of primary pupils.

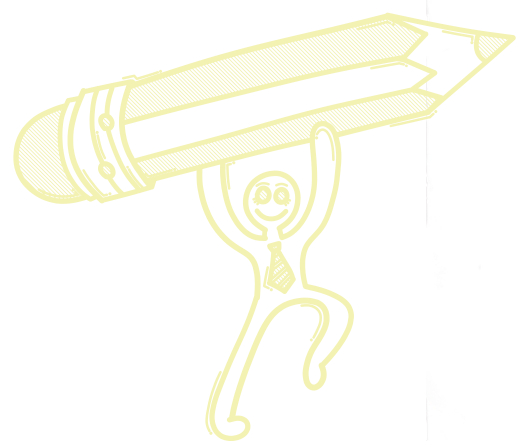
Students discover that businesses trade on a worldwide scale. They are introduced to the complexities of global trade between countries at different levels of economic development and the available resources at their disposal.

The Our World programme helps the students to develop a range of soft skills, including creativity, communication and organisational skills. It also helps build their confidence by encouraging students to present their ideas to the rest of the class.

This programme is kindly supported by the Scheinberg Family.

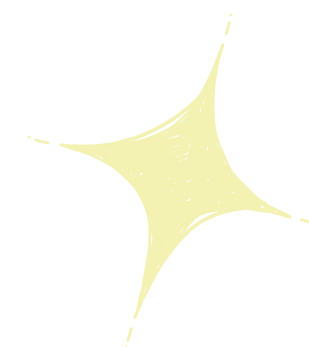
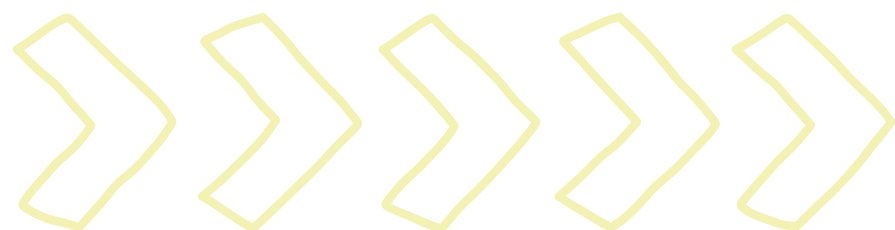

Heather Savage

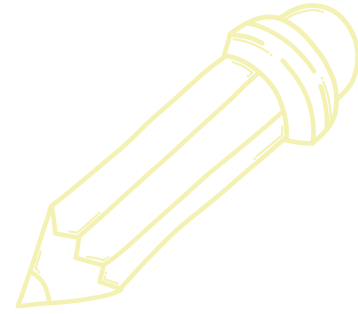
Before joining JA Isle of Man as a Programme Manager, **Heather** previously worked as a secondary school teacher.

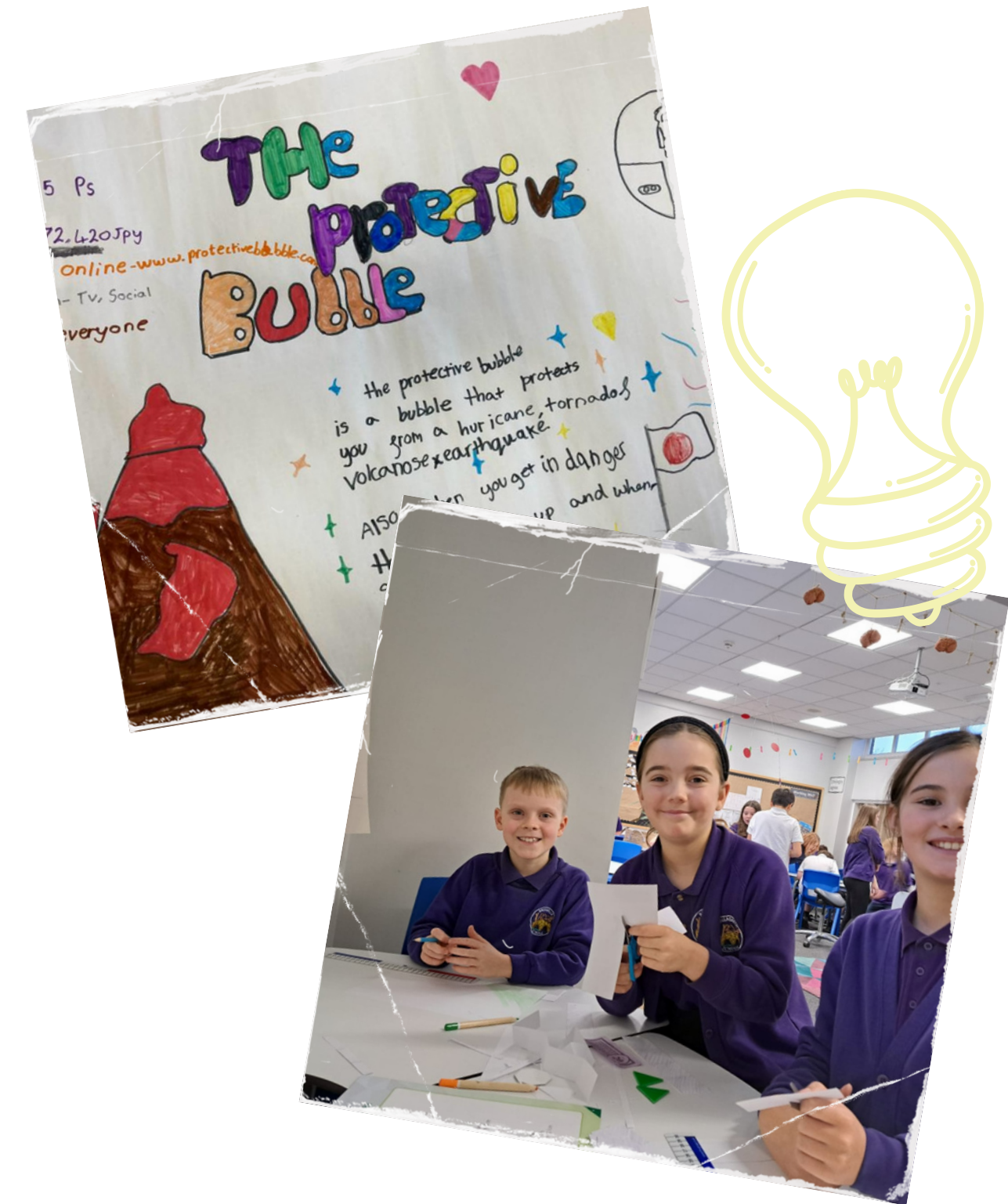

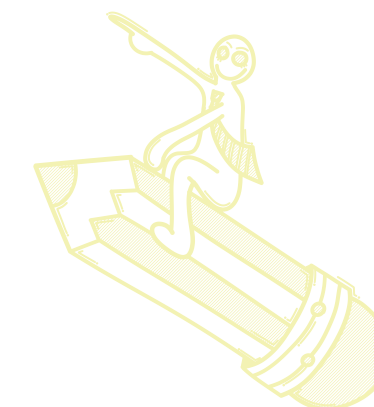
