Overview

The Get a Job programme has been designed to help young people understand how to apply for a job and secure an interview.

Students get to learn about the types of questions asked by employers, including how to answer competency-based questions. They are encouraged to start thinking about what they need to do to prepare for the recruitment process.

Taking into consideration previous feedback results, this academic year 24/25 the programme was updated, giving more emphasis to the elaboration of personal profiles, cover letters and how to put together a CV, which gives the students the opportunity to have a full CV done at the end of the programme.

Students' Feedback

After completing the programme, randomly selected classrooms received feedback forms. These feedback forms help the Junior Achievement Team evaluate the relevance of the programme and to look for areas of improvement.

Feedback Results


82%

of the students haven't had a job interview.

45%

of the students expressed that they feel more confident about applying for a job after completing the programme.





48%

of the students felt that they have enough knowledge to prepare for a job interview after completing the programme and **43%** acquired a basic knowledge about the interview topic.

57%


of the students felt that they had a basic knowledge and understanding of how to put together a CV. **38%** said they felt confident about it.

57%

of the students felt that they had a basic knowledge of writing a personal profile at the top of their CV. **33%** felt confident.



After completing the Get a Job Programme, how confident do you feel about looking for a job?




We asked students for feedback on the programme

Last year, 98% of the students thought that it would be helpful to have a website designed just for young people in the Isle of Man that would list job vacancies and let them store their CVs.

Although the website was already in development, **Justthejob.im** is now live and used in classrooms as part of our programmes. It helps young people on the Isle of Man find local job vacancies, store their CVs and access career tools and advice.
