This programme explores spending habits, how to use a bank account, the importance of saving, budgeting, responsible borrowing, credit ratings, dealing with debt, protecting yourself online, identity theft and scams.

Through hands-on practical activities, students explore the cost of living. They also learn why they should review regularly their bank statement and maintain a healthy balance.

Students benefit from the experience of the volunteers who deliver this programme, many of whom work within the finance sector.

Learning Outcomes

- Enables students to understand how bank accounts work, including mobile banking.
- Understand the importance of reading and checking bank statements regularly and keeping your personal details secure.
- Recognise the importance of budgeting and the need to save as part of managing your finances.
- Understand credit and APRs to provide students with the knowledge to borrow sensibly and avoid getting into debt.
- Learn about credit reports and how external agencies use them.
- Showing students what they can do if someone they know gets into debt.
- Helping students to recognise a scam and learn how to guard against identity theft.
